

PUBLIC NOTICE

Canadian Navigable Waters Act

West Kitikmeot Resources Corp. hereby gives notice that a submission has been added to the Common Project Search (online registry) pursuant to the *Canadian Navigable Waters Act* described herein and its description.

Pursuant to paragraphs 4.1 and 9.1 of the said Act, West Kitikmeot Resources Corp. has deposited with the Minister of Transport on the online Common Project Search Registry (<http://cps.canada.ca/>) and under registry number 12409, a description of the following work:

A geotechnical drilling program to inform the detailed design of the Grays Bay Road and Port Project is planned on ice and land at the proposed Port location on Grays Bay, in the Coronation Gulf between April 16 and May 15, 2025. The program includes rotary drilling at borehole locations from a portable drill and moved via helicopter. Drill depths are estimated to be up to 40 m from the sea ice surface and less than 350 m from the shoreline (perpendicular distance). The temporary area for drilling will be limited to a maximum area of 40 m x 40 m and will occur at one location at a time. The Coronation Gulf is seasonally covered in sea ice with no navigation between December and June annually. No permanent structures will be left in place that may interfere with navigation once the sea ice has melted.
