She is planning to teach Inuktitut and culture to students in Pond Inlet, where she will create classrooms in which children feel proud to speak their language, hear stories from elders and learn

about the land. Sula hopes to strengthen students' sense of belonging and identity, which she believes is just as important as academic success.

Maria graduated from the first year Nunavut Sivuniksavut Program in 2018 and is now in the second year of the Nunavut Teachers Education Program through the Nunavut Arctic College in Kugaaruk, Nunavut. Her short-term goal is to become a teacher in Nunavut where her presence as an Inuk teacher will help promote cultural pride and identity among students, while building their

confidence, and contribute to the local work force as teachers have a high turnover rate in smaller communities. Her long-term goal is to help shape an education system that is built by and for Inuit.
